Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I present here our parish's annual financial report for the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

The purpose of this report is to provide a collective understanding of where we are as a parish, how we



are seeking to be good stewards of our resources, and to ask in prayer where the Lord is leading us from here.

This particular report is a bit odd since it covers not only this past fiscal year, but also the fiscal years immediately before and during the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition to that, the time frame of this report spans the transition of the pastor, the director of business operations, school principal, and preschool director. This report also incorporates the changes made at the diocesan level to school tuition and teacher salaries and benefits.

GENEROSITY IN THE MIDST OF UNCERTAINTY

Thank you.

I begin this report with gratitude to the countless parishioners and staff members that have toiled in the Lord's vineyard here at Saint Joseph. We are here today because of the loving sacrifices made by so many. It is my prayer that we continue to live out the faith they have passed on to us.

I am further edified by the generosity shown by so many of our parishioners in the midst of the uncertainty of these past few years. I do not mean to rehash the trauma of the lock down, but it is important to acknowledge what we have journeyed through. We were forced to shut down all public ministry for three months. As a parish community, we could not celebrate Holy Week and Easter in person. We postponed First Communions. We had to close the doors of the grade school and preschool. We had no idea how long or how severe any of that would be. And yet, the Light of Christ continued to shine and the Hope of the Cross continued to fill our hearts.

For, through it all, we remained faithful. A short-term endeavor into weekly Adoration grew into a robust ministry of prayer and contemplation. And even though we canceled months of Masses, and limited how many people could worship at a time, our weekly collections stayed relatively close to our budgeted target. This is a clear fruit of living out our faith; generosity in the midst of uncertainty and faith in the moments of trial.

SCHOOL TUITION CHANGES

Bishop Kevin Rhoades and the Catholic Schools Office have made a clear commitment to our Catholic school teachers, which has manifested in significant salary increases (detailed on p. 5) in 2022 and 2023. The main mechanism for affording these salary increases is restructuring school tuition to allow for full utilization of the Indiana School Choice Scholarship Program (vouchers). Our grade school tuition policies needed to be modified, notably the elimination of multi-child discounts and teacher tuition benefits. Although our parish was in an excellent position to support teachers and families through these changes, we knew the transition would bring considerable uncertainty. Again, the response we have witnessed from our parents and stakeholders has been one of faith and generosity.

MOVING FORWARD

As this report will detail, we here at Saint Joseph Catholic Church & School are in a strong financial position. As a first year pastor, I know that it is not thanks to me, but to all those who have served before. I invite you to read through this financial report with a spirit of thanksgiving. I encourage you to pray for all of the ministries and people that we serve. And I pray that together we may continue to walk together along the Way.

St. Joseph, pray for us!




Financial Notes

- The increase in total parish income largely reflects the doubling of preschool tuition due to the recent expansion from 3 classrooms to 6.
- In 2020, the school received \$528,000 in Federal Payroll Protection (PPP) funds as it continued operations throughout the pandemic. The funds received are included in grade school income for the 2020-21 fiscal year.
- In 2021-22, the parish received an estate donation of \$80,000.
- Restrictions on in-person gatherings and economic uncertainty due to the pandemic contributed to lower-than-expected parish income in 2019-20. Income has rebounded since that time and continues to show steady increases.



Financial Notes

- Our parish school was awarded \$236,786 in funds from the State of Indiana through an Emergency Assistance to Non-public School (EANS) grant. These funds are intended to provide support to improve technology and other learning improvements to offset the impacts of the pandemic.
- In 2020, the school received \$528,000 in Federal Payroll Protection (PPP) funds as it continued operations throughout the pandemic. The funds received are included in grade school income for the 2020-21 fiscal year.

The parish subsidy is an amount budgeted each year as part of the expense of operating our educational ministry and helping parish families afford Catholic education at Saint Joseph. We continue to be diligent with budgeting to ensure the amount of the subsidy remains manageable for the parish.

Investing in the Future of Catholic Education

In December 2021, the Diocese announced a two-part initiative to strengthen the quality and financial stability of our Catholic schools. The first, in an effort to bolster teacher retention and recruitment with competitive pay, a salary increase of \$5,000 per teacher was implemented for the 2022-23 school year, with an additional \$5,000 increase to be instituted in the 2023-24 school year.

To assist in funding this investment in teachers, multi-child family tuition discounts and teacher free-tuition benefits were eliminated. However, this tuition restructuring allows Catholic schools and their families to fully utilize the recently-expanded Indiana School Choice Scholarship program.

Our parish has been in a solid financial position to support teachers and families through these changes, and we will continue to look for opportunities to assist families and invest in the excellence of our Catholic school educators.

We have seen a renewed interest and revitalization of outreach to local partner organizations such as Catholic Worker / Our Lady of the Road, Cultivate Food Rescue, Women's Care Center, Right to Life Michiana, as well as to our sick and homebound parishioners.

Christ is present in our parish and I hope you can join me in this renewed sense of hope and zeal for discipleship, evangelization, and service, that we might continue to make God known, loved, and served!

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

From October 1, 2021, to September 30, 2022, members of our parish's St. Vincent de Paul conference made 357 home visits, bringing prayer, compassion, and food valued at \$43,289 to 970 people. Our neighbors in need are very grateful for your financial donations and what you put in the blue bags.

HOPE MINISTRIES

Hope Ministries and St. Joe parishioners feed close to 200 people on the first Friday of each month. About 80-100 of



those people are residents at Hope. The rest are guests at Weather Amnesty (operated by the City of South Bend) and Motels4Now (operated by the Catholic Worker/Our Lady of the Road). The numbers drop in the summertime when the amnesty is closed. Depending on the menu and the number of guests, the meals cost between \$850-900 each month.

Making God Known, Loved, and Served

In FY22, our collections for Hope totalled \$8,000 while our expenses were \$10,000. Our parish is dedicated to continuing our Hope outreach, and is committed to subsidizing the cost of meals if donations from parishioners do not meet the need.

There are about 50 parishioner volunteers that have helped take part in this once-a-month ministry and Saint Joseph Parish has been dedicated to serving these meals for over 30 years now! The continued generosity of our parishioner coordinators, volunteers, and donors is much appreciated. We could not continue this outreach ministry without you!

GIVING TREE

Hundreds of gifts are collected and distributed each year through our Advent Giving Tree. Organizations we support include:

REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT

Thanks be to God, and to the astounding generosity of our parish community, the Rahim family arrived in South Bend in the last week of December 2021, after being evacuated from Afghanistan and spending a few months on a military base in Texas. Mom and Dad, along with eight children ranging in age from 3 to 18 moved into a home that was well prepared and stocked by a small army of St. Joe parishioners.

Our parish really came through in a big way to prepare for and support this refugee family, including donations totalling \$4,500. Thank you to everyone who donated and sorted items, prepared welcome baskets for the family, cleaned and set up the house, volunteered to transport the family to various appointments, and more!

Haiti Ministry: "Uniting Together for God's Glory"

In 2018, our parish was blessed to have formed a partnership with Mary Immaculate Parish in Platon, Haiti, so that we might offer prayer and solidarity between our Catholic communities. Additionally, we have been overwhelmed by the generous response of our parishioners in offering financial gifts to support our very disadvantaged brothers and sisters in an era of great turmoil in Haiti. Mary Immaculate has been able to complete simple but much-needed building projects, offer financial assistance to parishioners in great need, and supply lunch to their school children.
